The co-creation workshops aim to engage stakeholder in a highly interactive session to be moderated by National Hubs, with the support of some of the CMA observers. These sessions are meant to identify key policy, research and funding priorities and generate future cooperation ideas that stakeholders, the scientific community, and policymakers can consider adopting to support and further develop the Black Sea sustainable blue economy.

Discussions will be structured around the identification of

- a) emerging priorities and innovative ideas in each specific area
- b) existing obstacles and bottlenecks
- c) opportunities and next steps

The main outcomes of these co-creation workshops will be re-elaborated into a **white paper with recommendations** to the current and future CMA coordination(s), CMA observers and to the European Commission on **key priority areas** and **highly promising ideas** for the design of future cooperation opportunities (i.e., calls for proposals, regional initiatives, stakeholder events, etc.). The white paper will be made public on the CMA website and widely circulated among Black Sea stakeholders after the conference as a basis for further work.
